Coordinated Family Care, Middlesex County's Care Management Organization (CMO), is making available **\$67,697.70** to community-based service providers who are interested in expanding/enhancing/creating services in the following areas of need:

<u>Suicide Prevention & Supportive Services</u>: Highlighting community awareness of the subject while creating safe spaces that offer youth and families support in various ways.

**I/DD Social/Recreational Programming:** Inclusive services focusing on expressive arts with emphasis on social interactions, and movement when applicable, for varied abilities or needs.

*Equity, Diversity, & Inclusion*: Level the playing field by creating and enhancing access and cohesive services for youth and families of color within our systems.

*Health Care Systems as Social Determinants of Health to Improve the Overall Well-<u>Being of Families</u>: Expand healthcare coverage/access by increasing provider availability, while intensifying the quality of care in the community.* 

**Food Insecurity:** Bridging a gap with local food banks or pantries to enhance their ability to include and serve more of the county while being able to also directly identify and serve CSOC families in need.

Applicants may apply within every category, as well as a combination of the areas of need, Programming must take place in Middlesex County. Currently funded DCF services/programs are excluded.

The wraparound model of care is an approach that is child-centered, family driven, and community based. Emphasis is placed on the strengths of the child, family, and community. The priority is to keep children in their schools, at home, and in their communities.
